Exercise for Seniors from Jose Hernandez I recently came across this exercise suggested for seniors, to build muscle strength on the arms and shoulders. It seemed so easy that I thought I'd pass it along to others. The article suggested doing it three days a week

Begin by standing on a comfortable surface, where you have plenty of room on both sides.

With a 5 pound potato sack in each hand, extend your arms straight out from your sides to shoulder height and hold them there as long as you can. Try to reach a full minute, then relax.

With each passing day you will find that you can hold this position for just a bit longer.

After a couple of weeks, move up to 10 pound potato sacks, then 50 pound potato sacks, and eventually try to get to where you can lift a 100 pound potato sack in each hand and keep your arms straight for over a minute!!

After you gain some confidence at that level, put a potato in each sack.





After five years of largely futile efforts by the United Nations to bring peace to Bosnia-Herzegovina

(and stop unabated large scale "ethnic cleansing") the decisive intervention by NATO Forces in 1994/95 finally made this happen, and the Dayton Peace Accord was signed in Paris in December 1995. The Dayton Peace Accord foresaw as one of its prime peace tools the establishment of a unique, powerful, civilian institution, the Office of the High Representative (OHR). This was in addition to some

This was in addition to some 30,000 international military personnel being stationed in BiH under SFOR.

The head of the OHR is the High Representative (HR) who has his head office in Sarajevo and 4 Regional OHRs across the country. The HR position rotates every 2/3 years. The first HR was Carl Bild of Sweden who was succeeded by Carlos Westendorp of Sweden, Wolfgang Petritsch of Austria and Paddy Ashdown of the UK.

The OHR recruits its society.

The OHR recruits its senior staff from the international community.

staff from the international community.

To this very day, the OHR remains the ultimate legal and political authority in BiH (not the BiH Supreme Court!).

HR is ultimately responsible to the 55-nation member BiH Peace Implementation Council (PIC) that also oversees SFOR.

In terms of senior OHR positions, Canada (as well as other countries) had expressed an interest to bring in qualified staff for the infrastructure and public utilities fields. The responsibilities for this sector were expressly specified in Annex 9 of the Dayton Peace Accord (Commission on Public Corporations).

I, Karl Knechtel, applied in 1998 as part of an international competition for the respective senior management position i.e. the Secretary General of the Annex 9 Commission on Public Corporations.

I won; however, due to the military intervention in Kosovo

Commission on Public Corporations. I won; however, due to the military intervention in Kosovo commencement of my duties was delayed by one year.

After arrival in Sarajevo it became quickly obvious that I had entered more than just a developing/emerging country but also a military Theatre of Service" with some 20,000 international military personnel still present today. Naturally, much of the work in infrastructure and utilities involved dealing with NATO on a regular basis. There is even a specific Military Contact Cell office in OHR. I also had army and air force officers also had army and air force officers working directly for me in the Commission.

Commission.

My main task was to contribute to peace development by trying to achieve consensus among local BiH infrastructure and utility officials (often still divided since the end of the war and sometimes not even on speaking terms) with respect to rehabilitation and reconstruction activities and ultimately to forge cooperation. Where necessary would invoke OHR powers. The final goal would be the creation of national corporations (crown corporations) for the infrastructure and utility sectors.

I was able to operationalize the BiH Public Railway Corporation that had just been legally established prior to my arrival. I gave birth to a BiH Road Infrastructure Corporation, participated in the creation of the BiH Communications Regulatory Agency and launched work for the creation of a BiH Electric Power Transmission Agency. My main task was to contribute to

Germania Club Pembroke Celebrates 50th Anniversary

Members of the Germania Club, Pembroke, along with dignitaries and many other guests from the German community and beyond, celebrated the club's 50th anniversary on April 16, 2005.

Fifty years after its founding, the Pembroke Germania Club is still "a living club," says His Excellency Christian Pauls, Ambassador to Canada from Germany, who was one of the guests of honour at the celebration.

Ambassador Pauls said that, during his time in Canada, he has seen the remnants of a number of German clubs go down the drain.

"I have found the dedication and vitality here especially inspiring," he said.

In early 1955, a group of new immigrants came together in Pembroke to lay the building blocks for the new club.

They had arrived from Germany as part of a post World War II wave of newcomers seeking a better life in a new home. Many of them had got acquainted previously, drawn to each other by a sense of familiarity in a completely strange environment and their opportunity to speak their mother tongue.

The stage for the formation of the new club had been set a few months earlier. As the end of 1954 drew near, several of the newcomers had thought it appropriate to gather to celebrate New Year's Eve. All the suitable venues for the party were already booked for December 31, so they found a hall available for December 29 and celebrated New Year's Eve two days early.

"Born out of a sense of loneliness for their homeland, it was a place to carry on beloved traditions and social activities,' said Heidemarie Galazka, current Germania Club "This Pembroke president. eventually knit together a whole community of people of German ancestry, either new to the country or long established descendants of early settlers. Over the years, the club grew to welcome everyone who wanted to get to know the German culture, language, and customs."

At the anniversary celebration, Pembroke Mayor Ed Jacyno welcomed the ambassador and, on behalf of the city, presented him with a painting incorporating the Germania Hall, City Hall, and the court house.

"Our city hall was formerly the post office, through which letters to and from your German homeland travelled," he said. "The court house is significant, because it is here that many of you pledged your allegiance to this country when you became citizens of Canada."

"I know how hard the German community has worked over the years, and never asked anyone for anything. You have come here to help this country and community prosper and grow, and you have accomplished that."

There were greetings and presentations by MP Cheryl Gallant, MPP John Yakabuski, Renfrew County Warden Bob Sweet, and Laurentian Valley Reeve Jack Wilson.

Visiting dignitaries included ony Bergmeier, national Tony national president of the German-Canadian Congress, and umbrella organization for German clubs, and Ernst Friedel, his provincial counterpart. Another special guest was Rainer Triebe, president of the Maple Leaf Almrausch Club in Ottawa, the Pembroke Germania Club's closest neighbour.

A highlight of the evening was the unveiling of a painting incorporating the portraits of the nine people who have served the club as presidents since its founding in 1955, some of whom served multiple terms. They were Martin Bauernschmitt, Werner Schutt, Fred Krause, Hans Ebrecht, Albert Jansen, Karl Jaeger, Albert Dermann, Erwin Beck, and the current president, Heidi Galazka. Pembroke artist Iris Shields, who created the assisted painting, was in unveiling it by Ambassador Pauls.

With the support of local businesses, an anniversary book incorporating historical and current information on the club had been produced, and was distributed at the anniversary celebrations. The book also contained many photos going back to the early years of the club as well as memories of early club days submitted by several members.

Among those who celebrated the anniversary were the widow of Werner Schutt, the only Canadian-born president in the club's history. Dora Schutt, now 98, attended with her sons, Bernard and Murray of Pembroke, and Karl of Ottawa and their wives.

Karl recalled his father's term in the late 50s.

"We used to have the meetings in our house, and we kids used to have to rush around and dust the furniture to prepare for them," he said.

A son of the founding president, Friedhelm (Fred) Bauernschmitt, and his wife, Laurie, travelled all the way from Torrance, California for the event. They attended with Martin Bauernschmitt's other son, Hans, and his wife, Barbara, who reside in Pembroke.

Certificates honouring long service were presented to a number of members, including Hans Ebrecht, the only surviving founding member, who was honoured for 50 years of membership in the club.

Hella Bakautzki was recognized for 47 years, Bernhard Zettler, for 46 years, and Alfred Beck for 40 years. Honoured in their absence were Dr. Konstantin Siegmund and Mrs. Adele Siegmund, 41 years, and Ralf Hahn, 40 years.

Others honoured were: 39 years - Joe Kiendl, Albert Sack; 37 years - Weldon Remus and Marlyn Zadow; 36 years - Gerry Binhammer, Carl Baker, Edward Eichstaedt; 35 years - Martin Markus; 34 years - Harry Reitlingshoefer, Hildegard Leinen, Harold Collins; 33 years - Manfred Voegtle, Willi Schmidt; 32 years - John Wegner; 29 years - Reinhold Hagenah; 28 years - Rodney Risto; 27 years - Murray Lubitz, Rudi Kodrzynski, Bonnie Schmidt; 26 years - Albert Dermann, Harry Saring; 25 years - Bernhard Schroeder, Ken Kranz, Gordon Butler; 23 years - Peter Eder, Antaire Lubitz, Barbara Walsh; 21 years - Elisabeth Dermann, Werner Ullrich.

At present the club has about 200 members. The club hosts cultural events including Oktoberfest, Christkindlmarkt (a German Christmas market), and visiting cultural groups. It also supports various community causes and rents its hall for weddings and other community events.





The Pope's Adopted Hometown

History stands still in medieval Regensburg

The best preserved medieval city in Germany, Regensburg was the new pope's German home town. It presents a perfect combination of inviting skyline, impressive torical monuments and historical legendary Bavarian hospitality.

It does not require much fantasy to imagine the life in medieval ages. You just have to walk through the city center of Regensburg to experience what it was like to live in a city 2000 years ago. The city is alive with the aura of those golden days of the 12th and 13th centuries.

Regensburg, an important Roman frontier station known as the Castra Reginais, is one of the oldest German cities.

The city was one of the most prosperous commercial centers of Germany in medieval times, trading with India and the Middle East among others, making a name through its gold work and fabrics.

Regensburg was made a free imperial city in the year 1245. In the 16th century, German princes gathered in the city to meet with the Kaiser in the "Reichssaal" for sessions of the imperial parliament.

Ünlike other German important Regensburg cities.

was not bombed during the World War II, which is why all the historic monuments are still found intact and well preserved.

Pope's brother still lives in Regensburg

Among the many historical buildings in Regensburg, Saint Peter's Cathedral is the most important. It is an interesting example of pure German Gothic. It was founded in 1275 and given the final touches in 1869. Though the cathedral is small, the interior contains yet another "old cathedral" which dates back contains cathedral" cathedral" which dates back, perhaps to the 8th century, masterpieces of Peter Vischer and museums containing medieval and Renaissance church art. The cathedral has maintained a well known Boys' choir for more than 1000 years.

The choir, Regensburger known also Regensburger Domspatzen, or "Regensburg Cathedral Sparrows," was led by Georg Ratzinger, Pope Benedict XVI's brother, for many years. Ratzinger still lives in the city and the new pope owns a house just outside of tówn and regularly visited Regensburg, where he taught for many years.

Germany's first stone bridge is the Steinerne Brücke, completed in 1146. crosses Danube, Europe's longest river, at Regensburg and was the only way

to cross the river for hundreds of years. It was also the starting point of the second and third Crusades. The bridge provides a breath-taking view over the city. The bridge itself, 310 meters long, is an excellent example of medieval architecture.

Almost Italian?

Regensburg, which is north of the Alps, is often referred to as the most "northern town of Italy", mainly due to the high grandiose, patrician houses that embellish the city skyline. This image is further enhanced by the city's magnificent location, situated at the northernmost point of the Danube in the midst of small running hills.

Hard to imagine, but Regensburg has its dark side too. A visit to the Reichstag, which includes

Museum of the Perpetual Diet takes you to the dungeons and torture chamber. Instruments of torture tell tales of Regensburg known as the "Fragstatt"-the place of asking.

Unlike today, the difference was that the visitors weren't asking. If one interrögated and didn't want to answer, torture was applied generously. In contrast to other

German cities, the city has not changed has not changed much. The center has not been overwhelmed commercial

buildings and office goers. But, at the same time, one can find a healthy mixture of shops, offices, hotels and cafes.

are very narrow

The younger generation brings in the flair of a modern city so much so that Regensburg has an astounding number of bars and restaurants. Regensburg is a Mecca for jazz lovers. Every year, the city hosts a jazz festival where around 100 jazz bands can be heard performing in historical heard performing in historica courtyards of the old city centre.


