The Season for German Christmas Markets

During the festive season, the scent of roasted almonds and mulled wine fill the streets of German cities as shoppers in mittens and gloves pour over handmade ornaments and other goodies at Germany's Christmas markets.

Christmas markets are a centuriesold tradition that connects the Advent season -- the four weeks before Christmas -- to the baser pleasures of shopping. And even though Christmas in Germany also means tinsel and lights and extended shopping hours, it is the markets that set the country off from its Christian neighbors.

A typical Christmas market consists of wooden stalls perched on a site in the center of the city, where people shove past each other to buy Christmas decorations and stop for a chat over a mug of mulled wine. A nativity scene is usually on display and often musicians, singers and dance clubs offer entertainment from a central stage.

Long tradition

Since the century, mercha have traveled merchants to Dresden to display their wares. To this day, from Nov. 24 until Dec. 24, shoppers flock to the market in the city center which also features a Christmas pyramid, woodcarvings and a stollen festival, where a nearly four-ton heavy version of the fruit-cake-like German Christmas specialty that Dresden is famous for will be dished up.

Cologne has Christmas markets, one of which is situated next cathedrál. cathedral's towers, reaching some meters (490-feet) into the winter sky, make the giant Christmas tree in the middle of the setting appear quite small.

In the four weeks of December during which the markets are open, according to Karl-Heinz

Merfeld of the Cologne Tourism Association.

The Christmas market industry is still important ... and the tourists who come here are usually really excited -above all the English and Dutch -because they aren't familiar with these kinds of markets with the music and the lights," he said. In Augsburg's market, once called old the Lebkuchenmarkt after the gingerbread-like cookie called lebkuchen it sold, visitors still can find numerous varieties of the baked goods.

Centuries' old tradition

No trip to the Christmas market is complete without a bratwurst sausage or a cup of German mulled wine, which is spiced with cinnamon and cloves. It is said to have originated in India, where the drink was prepared with water, alcohol, sugar and spices. Apparently the British then brought the recipe to Europe in the 18th century. Folklore has it that at the Christmas market in Nuremberg, Germany's most famous, someone first added red wine to the mixture and created what's now known as *glühwein*. These days, about every third stall sells the stuff.

Still, Christmas markets have come a long way since they were first introduced in Germany. Dresden is said to have had the first, in the 15th century, and Nuremberg followed suit in 1697. In 1820, the first Christmas market was held in Cologne and restricted to locals who could buy toys and food but no alcoholic beverages.

Back to the past

Now Cologne holds a medieval Christmas market where salespeople wear wool and clothes wooden shoes and pursue medieval chores like blacksmithing. The smell of burning wood wafts through the air, and illuminate candles the setting. Nothing as profane as reibekuchen or potato pancakes is for sale; hungry visitors can snack on unleavened bread freshly baked in ovens heated with wood. Nor is *glühwein* available. Instead, thirsty drink mead.

Since Christmas didn't exist during medieval times, one of the organizers drew a tenuous link to the markets held long

ago. "The emphasis is on a market where there is peace and quiet as opposed to the other Christmas markets where the turbulences of every-day life dominant," he said.

Germany Beats Brazil to Win Women's World Cup

Germany's national women's soccer team made history on Sunday, Sept. 30, 2007 by becoming the first women's team to win the World Cup for the second time in a row as they beat Parail 3.0 in the final in beat Brazil 2-0 in the final in Shanghai.

Germany's women's soccer team powered their way to a thrilling 2-0 victory over Brazil with Birgit Prinz's goal in the 52nd minute and Simone Laudehr's header in the 86th bringing the team its second consecutive Women's World Cup title Cup title.

Germany's watertight defence didn't concede a single goal in the tournament, the first time ever that a soccer side has managed the feat. 31,000 fans in Shanghai's Hongkou Football Stadium watched the fast-paced FIFA Women's World Cup final.

Brazilian star striker Marta, the top scorer in the tournament, failed to get in a penalty kick past goalkeeper Nadine Angerer, a goal which would have tied the game in the second half. "After the penalty save, I felt it was meant to be," Germany coach Silvia Neid said.

"We worked hard for each other, it was a great team performance. It was important to work against Marta, and we did a good job in pushing her to the sidelines.

Missed Chances

The nimble-footed Brazilians were the better side in the first half, playing a fast aggressive game and piling up the pressure on the German defence.

Marta, who won the best player of the tournament award, had the first chance of the game in the fourth minute with a long range drive stopped easily by Angerer.

Seconds later, the physically stronger Germans went on the attack when Kerstin Garefrekes was set free on the right only to slice her shot into the side

In the 8th minute, Germany's powerful defence seemed to falter for an instant when goalkeeper Angerer failed to gather a free kick by Brazil's Daniela. The ball bounced out to Formiga but she was unable to put the ball in the net.

Daniela had another chance in the 23rd minute but was unlucky when she shot a left foot volley onto the post.

Heroic Saves by German Goalie

The Germans finally picked up pace in the second half, determinedly pushing forward. But it was only in the 52nd minute that they managed the breakthrough when Captain Birgit Prinz was fed a pass by Sandra Smisek. The veteran forward coolly slotted in the crossed

But it was Angerer who was the hero of the day when she stopped the spot kick by Martha with her knees and then again when she held a flying strike by substitute Rosana.

Despite dominating ball possession, Brazil's spirited attack failed to break through the solid German defence and they failed to find an equalizer. A stunning header by Simone Laudehr in the dying minutes of the game clinched the game for the ruthlessly efficient German side.

"Germany deserved to win'

"This was a very tough match, we missed a lot of chances especially when we were 1-0 down and Marta missed a critical penalty," said Brazil coach

"But Germany took their chances and scored. I'm very sad about this result but my players tried their best." The 21-year-old Marta said she was crushed after the defeat but that the team had to look ahead.

"It's difficult to express my feelings. The Germans deserved to win," she said. "But we have to keep our chin up and prepare for the Olympics in Beijing.

In the third-place play-off, two-time champions after she failed to score a the United States beat Norway 4-1.




