

Germany Records Balanced Budget for 2007 Information Source - http://www.ottawa.diplo.de

Back in the Black!

Germany last year managed to balance its budget for the first time in nearly 40 years, due to a sales tax increase and a stronger economy.

In 2007, the German government received 70 million euros (\$103 million) more than it spent,

million euros (\$103 million) more than it spent, according to figures released by the Federal Statistical Office (Destatis) in Wiesbaden on January 15. Last year, the budget deficit ran at 1.6 percent, or nearly 37 million euros. During the period 2002-2005, the government had breached a European Union-mandated limit of 3 percent of GDP, but Brussels suspended its deficit procedures against Germany in June last year.

The increase in value-added tax from 16 percent to 19 percent at the start of 2007 also contributed to the balanced budget.

For the coming year, however, the German government expects the deficit to grow again, as recent business tax and unemployment insurance reforms will result in reduced tax takings.

Solid Economic Growth

The Destatis figures showed the German economy grew by 2.5 percent last year. This was down slightly from 2006, when a 2.9 growth rate marked the fastest expansion of the German economy since the turn of the decade.

Exports and investment were the main drivers of Germany's growth in 2007. Destatis said German exports, a traditional strong point, grew by 8.3 percent last year and accounted for more than half of the growth in GDP. (TWIG/Deutsche Welle)

Bombardier Sells Four Global 5000 Jets to German Ministry Of Defence

Information Source -http://www.ottawa.diplo.de Bombardier recently announced the sale of four high-speed Global 5000 jets, which will be operated by the German Ministry of Defence's (MoD) Special Mission Wing for VIP transport and Medical Evacuation (MedEvac) flights. The aircraft are scheduled for delivery in 2011.



The Global 5000 jets were selected by the Federal Office for Defence The Global 5000 jets were selected by the Federal Office for Defence Technology and Procurement in Germany (BWB), as part of a broader agreement regarding the modernization of the MoD's Special Mission Wing. Lufthansa Technik AG of Hamburg, Germany, is the prime contractor for the overall agreement, which also includes the purchase of two Airbus A319 Corporate Jetliners. The six new aircraft will replace the MoD's existing fleet of Challenger 601 aircraft.

The four Global 5000 jets will be completed at Bombardier's Global aircraft completion centre in Montreal and Lufthansa Bombardier Aviation Services in Berlin will provide technical support for the jets. (German Embassy with files from Bombardier) Bombardier Website





According to tradition, Rose House is constructed from salvaged timber from the community's original Lutheran Church. Peter and his wife, Christina Bongard, raised 11 children in this modest farmhouse.







The task of the three books took her some 14 years to complete, prompting her to travel to Germany to see the region where most of the Thorne Centre-Ladysmith families immigrated from.

She travelled four times to Alberta and Vancouver to obtain information. The most difficult part was trying to persuade the people to give her the information and pictures for the book.

The three books, and in particular "My Little Log Home In The Hills" (The West Prussian German Settlement of Ladysmith Quebec-Thorne County) were accepted with a lot of praise, enjoyment and satisfaction from people now knowing who they were related to.

She felt relieved and satisfied that it was finally done. After she completed and published the book "My Little Log Home In The Hills", numerous people from all over North America would

Elizabeth would have probably started another book, if she had not taken up wood working for a while.

She never recovered her expenses relating to producing the books, to her it was a sense of satisfaction and achievement towards her community where she was born, it was a true labour of love.

The book "My Little Log Home In The Hills" is still available from Elizabeth's daughter Janice, with the same eMail address, shown below. However, the phone number has changed (also listed below), because Gordon her husband now 81, does not hear well anymore.

I had great respect and admiration for Elizabeth Fierobin. I can remember the many trips to Ottawa Elizabeth made, and she always would visit my mother Louila (Moore) Bork, to collect more information. The enormous effort she put into the book "My little log home in the hills", will be invaluable to countless future generations interested in tracing their family ancestry!

The life of Elizabeth Fierobin will live on in her work, the result of her generosity and sense of history, as researchers continue to access it.
