Hulda Erfle was born in the German settlement of Teplitz, Bessarabian Russia. Teplitz Beserabien no longer exists, but it was an area by the Black Sea prior to the WWII (see website links below)

When the Russians invaded this area, the family had to flee with only their clothes, my two brothers, a horse and wagon. They fled to Poland where they were kept in work camps and my sister Gerda was born there. After the war they returned to Aub Germany where I was born and in 1954 moved to a little town called Hegenlohe about 30 km north of Stuttgart, where we lived until 1960. Hulda Erfle, after surviving two world wars and living in Polish concentration camps, immigrated to Canada on May 1st, 1960 from Germany with her husband August and her son Karl to join her son Helmut, who had immigrated to Canada in 1956, and her daughter Gerda who immigrated in 1959. Her other Son Alfred remained in Germany where he lives with his wife and 3 children. He joined her for her 100th birthday in 2008.

Countless children are thankful that Hulda Erfle's favourite pastime was knitting. She was known as "Oma", German for Grandma, by everyone in her small town of Ladysmith, Quebec, and she fulfilled that grandmotherly image to a tee. She has spent much time knitting colourful toques for the snow suit fund with yarn donated by Yarn Forward Sew On.

Oma learned how to knit from her mother at the age of 10, as she wanted to make her brother a pair of socks for Christmas, and she has not put the needles down since then. Oma had a very giving nature, she provided plenty of German home cooked food for the family and kept their feet warm in colourful knit slippers. She has also been active in her community and appreciated all their support.

NOTE: The skills required for this sport are so close to those of small bore and full bore shooting that many athletes use the Air Rifle as an indoor winter sport to practice for the outdoor seasons. Air Rifle is shot at 10 metres distance using a target with a 10 ring of 0.4mm (approximately the diameter of a pin head) and the 9 ring is just slightly larger than the .177¢ diameter of the pellet. With a bull's-eye the size of a pinhead, this is no casual "plinking" sport. Air Rifle is shot by both men and women in competitions from club level to the Olympic Games. This discipline first made its debut at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games.
